

Election Game Guidelines

With your group, create a game that asks players to use their knowledge about the election. Remember that the point is to show off your knowledge, and allow your classmates to review. Do not make complicated steps that distract from this. Do be creative, and have fun!

Your group should decide who will take each role. At no time should someone be sitting still- help each other to create your game.

Designer: While everyone can contribute ideas, one person should oversee the design of the game so there is a clear plan. You will work as a coordinator between the researchers and creators to make sure everything is in order. It is also your job to write the rules of the game.

Researcher(s): One or two people should look through your previous work on the election and consult the Mini Pages to make your game questions/ words, etc. Decide what information is important and what can be left out. When you are finished, you can help the creators make the game.

Creator(s): One or two people will create the game using the Designer's plan. Choose the materials that will work best, and make sure the game incorporates the researchers' findings. If you think some important information has been left out, consult with the researchers.

Your game MUST include the following words/concepts:
